**"Niagara Movement" Interesting to
Colored Man.**

Colored men from eighteen different
States held a national conference at No.
521 Michigan Street yesterday, adopting
resolutions looking forward to the better-
ment of the race and the abolition of all
caste distinctions based simply on race
and color. It is called the "Niagara
Movement." Prof. W. E. DuBois of At-
lanta, Ga., author of "The Souls of Black
Men," prepared the principles of the
movement.

The platform of this organization in-
cludes freedom of speech and criticism;
an unfettered and unsubdized press; no
caste distinctions of race and color; rec-
ognition of human brotherhood as a prac-
tical present creed; a belief in the dignity
of manual toil and other good things.
The conference will conclude Thursday.
